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VISITING LECTURERS

Axel Schulze will be the visiting GDR-writer at the Department of Modern Languages of the University of Northern Iowa during Spring Semester 1990.

Born in 1943 in Frose bei Aschersleben, Schulze began writing in his early twenties, encouraged by Gerhard and Christa Wolf. In

January 1962 he took part in the first public *Lyrikforum der DDR* which was organized by Stephan Hermlin in the *Akademie der Künste*. From 1964 until 1968 Schulze studied in Leipzig at the Johannes R. Becher Literature Institute. His first volume of poetry *Nachrichten von einem Sommer* received the *Förderungspreis für junge Literatur* in 1968, the year Schulze joined the *Schriftstellerverband der DDR*. Since then he has been a stage director in Halle at the *Landestheater* and an advisor and copywriter for the drama magazine *Anregung*, has travelled extensively in the Soviet Union (esp. in Georgia and Armenia), Poland, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Romania and Yugoslavia, and has done many adaptations of the work of modern Soviet poets. Schulze has lived in Berlin since 1975. He was invited to the US in 1981 by the International Writing Program. He regularly contributes essays and articles of criticism to *Neue Deutsche Literatur*, published by the *Schriftstellerverband der DDR*.

Dr. Terese Hörnigk, author of a recent study on Christa Wolf, will be at Dickinson College from July 9 to July 27 for a Summer workshop on Christa Wolf. In late August she will be available to lecture on Christa Wolf at other institutions. For more information, see CONFERENCES.

Jens Reich, a founding member of New Forum Berlin, spoke on February 6 at the Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies. His was the fourth seminar and discussion in the series "Prospects for Democratic Reform in the German Democratic Republic" organized by the American Institute for Contemporary German Studies of Johns Hopkins University. Other lecturers in this series were Uwe-Jens Heuer and Matthias Wissmann.

The colloquium, which is organized by the Modern Languages Department of the University with support from the German Academic Exchange Service and the Goethe-Institut of Manchester, will be held at the University of Bradford, 18 - 20 April 1990. The program will consist of short papers, long papers, and discussion sections. There will be about 25 speakers from England and abroad, covering topics of concern to both German Nations.

A brief selection of some topics covered includes Prof. Dr. Theo Buck (Aachen), who will speak on "Die deutsche 'Oktober-

revolution' und die Schriftsteller." Dr. Axel Goodbody (Bath) will speak on "Environmental issues in East and West German poetry since the 1950s." Peter Graves (Leicester) will speak on "East-West memories of a lost summer: Christa Wolf and Sarah Kirsch." Dr. Katrin Kohl (Oxford) will speak on "Common language in context. Cliché and quotation in contemporary East and West German literature." Karen Leeder (Oxford) will speak on "The Question of Political Engagement in Contemporary Poetry." Dr. Ricarda Schmidt (Scheffield) will speak on "The concept of identity in recent East and West German women's writing." Many other writers--Bachmann, Czechowski, Härtling, Hein, etc.--will also be covered.
